Early Learning/Early Care & Education (ECE)

DIRECT SERVICES PROVIDED

ECPAC started an Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (ECMHC) program with the support of 3 funders who supported 11 ECE programs, 15 classrooms, and 40 children and families, and made over 90 referrals for community services. Six of these programs and 9 of these classrooms were supported in partnership with ECPAC's coaching team.

ECPAC hired a Family Child Care

dedicated to this group of providers.

Home Navigator specifically

Of the 82 ECE programs engaged

in quality improvement efforts, 5.2%

more programs reached a Level 3-5.

Sixty individual ECE providers received individualized career navigation support. In partnership with Denver's Early Childhood Council and Joint Initiatives for Youth & Families, an ECE career navigation model was developed and 237 early childhood educators were supported in meeting their career goals.

ECPAC launched a <u>new website</u> to support all programs in marketing their business while simultaneously providing families with information on program availability and offerings in searching for early care and education.

SYSTEMS LEVEL DRIVERS IMPACTED

Towards stronger partnerships and shared accountability for improved outcomes, ECPAC led several collaboratives including ECE Workforce and ECE Access and Affordability - focused this year on the initial planning for Universal Preschool and the Local Coordinating Organization for this work.

ECPAC's ECE Career Navigation program engaged 26 local partners and 9 state/shared partners to support improved systems and policies.

LOOKING AHEAD:

ECPAC looks forward to being an active partner in the development of the Local Coordinating Organization to oversee the roll out of Universal Pre-K in the Fall of 2023.

Child & Family Health & Wellbeing

DIRECT SERVICES PROVIDED

ECPAC opened its Family Resource and Support Center which offers care navigation, classes and groups for families, access to emergency basic needs, and co-located services with community partners. ECPAC provided classes and groups to 68 (unduplicated) families, including the implementation of a new 10-week series focused on supporting language development in young children.

ECPAC provided care navigation to 185 families and a total of 368 supportive referrals to community-based services. 83 families received more intensive care navigation, which may have included home visits, accompanying families to appointments, and/or multiple meetings.

ECPAC continued providing care packages to families, including those quarantining due to COVID - 424 care packages were provided along with resource navigation support.

ECOSYSTEM BARRIERS EXPLAINED

SYSTEMS LEVEL DRIVERS IMPACTED

Towards stronger partnerships and shared accountability for improved child and family outcomes, ECPAC led several collaborations including Child Maltreatment Prevention, Commerce City Services Alignment, and Strengthening Families Alignment with Adams County Human Services and Tri-County Health Department.

to collect data to inform the recommendation for an online referral platform that will be implemented in Fall 2022 towards reducing the number of families who "fall through the cracks."

ECPAC worked closely with 18 organizations and 4 family partners to plan for and design the Commerce City Community Campus (C4) at South Platte Crossing - an integrated service delivery model with a strong referral system to outside services.

children and families impacted by substance use included the expansion of the support group Circle of Parents in Recovery and the provision of a new training focused on the brain and the disease of addiction, reducing shame and stigma, and a layperson's guide to administering naloxone. This training had 140 attendees.

LOOKING AHEAD:

ECPAC is looking forward to strengthening our partnership with Almost Home through the co-location of our Family Support Specialists in Brighton.

Additional Systems & Core Business

DIRECT SERVICES PROVIDED

ECPAC supported <u>9 legislative bills</u> this year - all of which passed and ECPAC will support implementation.

ECPAC continued to work with Growing Home and Maiker Housing Partners in the final development of an Institute to support community and family members in their advocacy skills and knowledge.

ECPAC hired our first Family
Engagement & Leadership
Coordinator who worked with family
partners to develop a Family and
Caregiver Advisory Council. ECPAC
also hired 2 additional family partners
for a total of 3 staff being previous
family partners.

Partners rated ECPAC's ability to move work according to the legislation that established councils through our Action Team structure for ECPAC's ability to increase capacity (92%), increase quality (100%) and increase access and affordability (100%).

SYSTEMS LEVEL DRIVERS IMPACTED

To support high quality services, ECPAC provided 47 separate training/professional development opportunities. In total, 1,392 (duplicated) and 656 (unduplicated) people attended at least one training and 81 organizations had at least one staff attend training.

ECPAC supported efforts related to equity by offering 5 equity-focused trainings for community partners and continuing use of our Equity Impact Statement for decision making at the Board, Staff, and Partner levels.

More than 2,000 physical materials were distributed to families with social norming messages promoting help-seeking, the 5 Protective Factors, and the importance of sober caregiving and safe storage practices.

LOOKING AHEAD:

ECPAC is looking forward to honoring our **Equity Impact Statement** commitment to Authentic Stakeholder Engagement and Leadership through the Advisory Council and work with community partners to increase advocacy skills and knowledge.




