# Introduction and Background

Reaching the end of its ambitious 2015–2020 strategic plan, the Early Childhood Partnership of Adams County (ECPAC) contracted with Joining Vision and Action (JVA) to facilitate a new strategic planning process that built upon past successes, stayed true to its origins and core purpose, and incorporated diverse stakeholder voices.

Beginning in fall 2019, ECPAC and JVA facilitated multiple engagements with stakeholders, including:

- One meeting with board members to develop the "big picture" direction, overarching framework, and goals
- One meeting with community partners to provide collaborative perspectives on crafting goals and strategies
- Two meetings with families who have worked with ECPAC, one facilitated in English and one in Spanish, to inform
  participant experience and needs moving forward
- Two meetings with staff members, one to focus on defining core values and one to gather insights into strategies

Information gathered from these meetings, in partnership with ECPAC leadership, was analyzed and synthesized into five primary areas of work that complement core focus areas established for Early Childhood Councils (ECCs), including quality, accessibility (as well as affordability), capacity, availability, and systems. Demographics and trends within the early childhood sector, both locally and statewide, were also reviewed and cross-referenced with organizational strengths to identify opportunities for ultimate impact.

This document shares the "big picture" guiding framework, goals, objectives, and strategies for a three-year period beginning on July 1, 2020 and ending on June 30, 2023. While this plan is considered the roadmap, ECPAC is committed to being responsive and providing the most relevant services for its community. As such and given unexpected events like the COVID-19 pandemic occurring during the development of this plan, ECPAC acknowledges the possibility of pivoting as appropriate to best meet the needs of Adams County. The ECPAC Governing Board made the determination to extend this plan one more year through June 2024 due to the quickly changing early childhood landscape due to the COVID funded programming and Universal Pre-K rolling out in Fall 2023. With this extension, minor revisions were made to reflect the evolution of ECPAC's work from 2020-2023. The Board additionally updated ECPAC's vision and mission to be inclusive of "early childhood professionals" as of July 2023.

# Strategic Foundation: Identity and Purpose

ECPAC is a partnership of community service organizations, families, and other key stakeholders such as elected officials and businesses, working together to increase equitable access to affordable, high-quality early childhood and family services and supports in the areas of early learning, health/mental health, and family support/education toward the ultimate goal that: all Adams County children enter kindergarten healthy and ready to learn and succeed.

Vision: All children, their families, and early childhood professionals are valued, healthy, and thriving.

**Mission**: Building a community where every young child, their family, and early childhood professionals can reach their full potential.



#### **Core Business**

The Early Childhood Partnership of Adams County (ECPAC) is the official Early Childhood Council serving Adams County. Through legislation, ECPAC is charged to improve the system serving young children by improving equitable access to affordable, high-quality services in early learning, health/mental health, and family support and education, towards the ultimate goal that all children enter kindergarten healthy and ready to learn and succeed.

ECPAC's role to facilitate communitywide efforts to address complex social issues related to kindergarten readiness include strategies to prevent and mitigate against the impacts of high poverty, high child abuse and neglect rates, low academic performance, and lack of a valued early childhood workforce. It is recognized that children grow and thrive in the context of relationships with adults (families, communities, and early childhood professionals) and therefore necessary to address the full early childhood ecosystem.

ECPAC accomplished this through its core business to equitably improve systems through:

- Ensure a strong governance system that supports its core business.
- Build and maintain a strong partnership that promotes shared accountability for improved child and family outcomes and is fully engaged in the agreed upon community strategic plan.
- Fostering leadership of community/family members and service providers.
- Ensuring sufficient investments are available through sharing resources, improved use of existing resources and obtaining new resources.
- Strengthening the public will to best support young children and their families.
- Working together to address system and policy barriers to improved outcomes.
- Providing professional development opportunities to improve the quality of cross-domain early childhood services towards maximum benefit.

ECPAC provides direct services to early care and education programs and to families of young children in collaboration with other community partners to fill gaps and reduce barriers as identified through assessments with partners and the community. On-going evaluation of services inform systems change.

## **Partnership Guiding Principles**

ECPAC is a governing and collaborative body with multiple perspectives and sets of values from each of its community organization and family partners. However, its partners have identified shared points of emphasis and focus for their work together. These "guiding principles" are as follows:

- To be accountable for access and quality. Agencies will hold each other accountable for the accessibility, quality of services, and use of funding.
- To be adaptable and flexible. The system has an ongoing and dynamic process of adapting to changing community needs and continuous quality improvement.
- To incorporate assessment of practices and outcomes. There is a continuous assessment of programmatic, organizational, and financial outcomes to determine effectiveness.
- To provide comprehensive and collaborative services. The system has a comprehensive service array that is delivered in a collaborative manner.
- To provide culturally responsive services. Services and supports are delivered in a manner that fits with the family's culture, values, and beliefs and considers the whole child in a strength-based approach.
- **To support family involvement and leadership.** Authentic family involvement exists both at the service level and the systems level and families are supported to become leaders in their community.
- To be sustainable and efficient. Agencies share certain funding streams and resources and find creative ways to use resources and promote efficiency.

## **Organizational Core Values**

Underpinning ECPAC's ultimate goal, vision, and mission are its core values—the key tenets of operations that are to be upheld no matter what. To that end, ECPAC staff identified the following core values to guide short-term and long-term decision making:

# **EQUITY**

ECPAC creates an environment of trust, promotes honest conversations, and strives to make decisions tht help reduce system inquities and biases.

#### **PROFESSIONALISM**

ECPAC is an organization that provides dependable leaders to work in the community who strive for excellence and offer expertise in a respectful and collaborative manner.

#### **EXCELLENCE**

ECPAC is an organization that is accountable, innovative, adaptable and bold; promotes the delivery of high-quality service to our partners and community; and supports leadership.

### **TEAMWORK**

ECPAC is an organization that values everyone for their unique role and strengths and creates a welcoming, compassionate, collaborative, and supportive team-based work environment.

#### INTEGRITY

ECPAC is dependable, reliable, and trustworthy; ensures good follow through; and maintains confidentiality, honesty, and openness whether information is favorable or unfavorable.

#### **DEDICATION**

ECPAC staff are dedicated and loyal to our organizational mission of helping children and families thrive.

Strengthen available best- practice and equity-based professional development opportunities and support implementation.	Increase community-wide participation in informational sessions, and professional development opportunities.
	Promote and offer trainings to include equity-related offerings, such as cultural humility and responsiveness, trauma-informed care practices and principles, and identification and decrease of stigmas.

Increase <b>engagement</b> with family-centered resources.	Ensure families who participate in services guide decisions in planning, implementation, and evaluation.
	Engage partners to use social norms for help-seeking, positive parenting, and the protective factors and disseminate these through various communication mechanisms.
	Implement and increase awareness related to the following frameworks and approaches: the Two-Generation Approach, Social Determinants of Health, and the Strengthening Families Framework.
	Expand marketing efforts to increase visibility of and knowledge about available services.
	Incorporate trauma-informed design recommendations alongside partners and across resource hubs.
Increase access to and availability of resources that support family stability, health, and well-being.	Develop and expand resource hubs or available hub services, and opportunities for co-location, to increase access for underserved communities through strong partnerships, collective accountability, and shared resources.
	Expand quantity and flexibility of home- and community-based services to address gaps and barriers to access.
	Support partners to implement the common resource and referral platform and use community-level data to inform decision.
	Provide high-quality, culturally meaningful direct services and supports to families in order to fill gaps and address community needs, including resource navigation, classes and groups.

Objective	Strategies
Increase capacity and availability and affordability of quality early childhood education and care.	Increase the number of childcare slots available in high-quality programs for all children in the Colorado Child Care Assistance Program (Community Dispersion of High Quality CCCAP and Children Served in High Quality Programs).
	Promote the Colorado Shines Quality Rating and Improvement System and the Early Learning Developmental Guidelines/Playbook at least monthly.
	Promote high-quality early care and education – including strong business practices - through professional development and coaching.
	Increase Colorado Shines Quality Rating and Improvement System Engagement at a Level 2 or higher to 60% through high-quality coaching supports.
	Support ECE providers to create environments that foster social emotional development and address persistent behaviors that adults find challenging as well as for children with developmental delays, disabilities, and special needs through training and early childhood mental health consultation.
	Support families to have real-time data on available childcare openings.
	Increase the number of early care and education programs/slots available to serve infants and toddlers and universal preschool through advocacy and pre-licensing supports.
Increase advocacy efforts for the development of and access to early childcare and education funding.	Align efforts with the Local Coordinating Organization (LCO) and community partners regarding collaborative funding discussions for the birth-five early care and education system.
	Raise awareness for and promote investment in early care and education funding opportunities and initiatives towards both sustaining and/or expanding current programming and starting new programming.
	Advocate for equitable access to early care and education funding, reimbursement, and related policies.
Strengthen the early care and education (ECE) workforce and pipeline.	Refine and implement an Early Care and Education Career Navigation Model.
	Support investments into the ECE Workforce.
	Advocate for state and local policies that support the ECE workforce which support recruitment, retention, and compensation.

Objective	Strategies
Increase <b>alignment</b> of staff wellness with program needs and organizational resources.	Assess regularly staff duties and organizational structure to ensure compatibility with available resources, strategic priorities, program requirements, and staff strengths and interests.
	Enhance staff engagement in program decision-making processes and support opportunities for leadership.
	Cultivate a culture that supports transparency and all organizational values.
	Complete an annual staff survey to understand employee experience/perspective, alignment of organizational culture with ECPAC's core business and values, and to support engagement in continuous quality improvement accordingly.
	Position programming to be flexible, nimble, and responsive to internal and external factors.
Increase efficiency and	Complete biannual board assessment to inform and set and monitor improvement towards capacity and effectiveness goals.

# **Recommendations and Closing**

ECPAC has a robust and celebrated history of being a leader and positive change catalyst within the early childhood field, not only in Adams County but statewide and nationwide. This trajectory is anticipated to continue to climb with the implementation of the strategic plan outlined above. To help stay focused on its goals and intended outcomes, it is recommended that ECPAC institute a "strategy screen" to help determine how future opportunities or partnerships may fit within its aims, including the following questions:

- Will this opportunity support the achievement of our vision?
- Will this opportunity support our mission?
- Does this opportunity align with <u>all</u> of our Partnership guiding principles?
- Does this opportunity align with <u>all</u> of our Organizational core values?
- Do we have the resources, staff capacity, and partnership engagement to be successful?

The answer to the above questions should be an unequivocal "yes." If so, the following should also be considered:

- Will this opportunity negatively impact capacity or resources (e.g., staff, program delivery, etc.)?
- Would another partner be better equipped or positioned to take the lead?

If current staff would be unnecessarily taxed, or another partner may be a better fit, it is recommended that discussions continue before ECPAC commits to any additional activities that are outside the scope of this strategic plan. If ECPAC keeps these questions top of mind and continues its exceptional level of coordination with and consideration of all its stakeholders, the "big picture" for early childhood providers and families in 2024 looks bright.
